FINDING THE RIGHT BALANCE BETWEEN HAZARDOUS DRUGS AND HAZARDOUS WASTE

She founded PharmEcology Associates, LLC in 2000 and sold the company to Waste Management in 2009. She co-founded Capital Returns, Inc., a nationally known pharmaceutical reverse distributor in 1991, and for 10 years served as president and chief regulatory advisor. Ms. Smith is a registered pharmacist who received her BS in Pharmacy and MS in Continuing and Vocational Education from the University of Wisconsin. She is a member of the Pharmacy Society of Wisconsin, the American Society of Health-System Pharmacists, and the American Society of Consultant Pharmacists.

Charlotte is passionate about protecting the environment and healthcare workers. She is the primary author of "A 10-Step Blueprint for Managing Pharmaceutical Waste in US Healthcare Facilities 2022 Edition" to be released by USEPA later this year and has provided editorial support on best practices for hazardous drug disposal to The Oncology Nursing Society's periodic revisions of "Safe Handling of Hazardous Drugs".
