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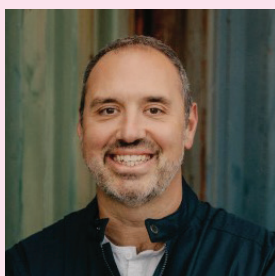

SCALING CLINICAL AI IN HEALTH SYSTEM PHARMACY

Dr. Carey is an Adjunct Instructor of Pharmacy Practice at the University of Illinois College of Pharmacy and precepts students from multiple colleges of pharmacy. Dr. Carey received the "Preceptor of the Year" award from Midwestern University in 2003 and was the Illinois Pharmacist of the Year in 2024.

Dr. Carey's primary focus in his role is expanding clinical and operational pharmacy services to optimize patient care and safety. Examples including establishing one of the first emergency room clinical pharmacy programs in Illinois; establishing a PGY1 Pharmacy Residency program; establishing on-site Anticoagulation Clinic which is the only clinic in Illinois to achieve "Anticoagulation Center of Excellence" recognition; established one of the first fully operational hospital-owned Specialty Pharmacies in Illinois.

Grant Sivley serves as Director of Pharmacy Data Analytics for Lifepoint Health. He completed PGY1 and PGY2 residencies in Pharmacy Informatics through Lifepoint Health and Lipscomb University. In his current role, he leads enterprise pharmacy analytics initiatives that support formulary management, financial stewardship, and operational performance across a large multihospital health system. He partners with pharmacy leaders to use data to support decisions and improve consistency across the organization.

As a board-certified pharmacotherapy specialist, Dr. Sivley's areas of expertise include pharmacy operations and healthcare analytics. He also has a professional interest in the evolving role of artificial intelligence and its practical application in healthcare. EDUCATIONAL SESSION

FROM STRATEGY TO SPEND: OPERATIONALIZING PHARMACY SUPPLY CHAIN DECISIONS IN A VOLATILE MARKET

TYLER VEST, PHARM.D., M.S., M.S.S.C.M., BCPS, BCSCP, FNCAP

Tyler Vest, is a Research Associate Professor at the University of Mississippi School of Pharmacy and a recognized leader in healthcare supply chain and hospital pharmacy operations. His work focuses on advancing pharmacy supply chain, developing procurement strategy, drug shortage management, improving the medication use process, and operational excellence across health systems.

Dr. Vest completed his pre-pharmacy studies at the University of Kentucky and earned his Doctor of Pharmacy from the University of Cincinnati James L. Winkle College of Pharmacy. He went on to complete a Master of Science in Pharmaceutical Sciences with a specialization in Health-System Pharmacy Administration at the UNC Eshelman School of Pharmacy, as well as a Master of Science in Supply Chain Management from the University of Kentucky Gatton College of Business and Economics. He also completed both a PGY1 Pharmacy Practice Residency and a PGY2 Health-System Pharmacy Administration Residency at the University of North Carolina Medical Center.

Dr. Vest is known for bridging strategic supply chain initiatives with frontline pharmacy execution, helping organizations improve medication access, reduce financial risk, and optimize purchasing and inventory performance in volatile market conditions. Dr. Vest is actively engaged in advancing the pharmacy profession. At the state level, he is involved with the North Carolina Association of Pharmacists (NCAP) and the Mississippi Society of Health-System Pharmacists (MSHP). Nationally, he serves in multiple roles within the American Society of Health-System Pharmacists (ASHP), contributing to initiatives focused on pharmacy leadership, practice advancement, and supply chain resilience. Through his academic, research, and professional efforts, Dr. Vest continues to collaborate with pharmacy leaders, buyers, and health systems nationwide to strengthen pharmacy operations and elevate the role of pharmacy within the broader healthcare supply chain.

Dr. Michael Stepanovic, is an Assistant Professor at the UNC Eshelman School of Pharmacy and a leader in pharmacy administration, leadership development, patient safety, and medication supply chain strategy. His work focuses on preparing pharmacists for strategic and administrative roles within complex healthcare systems, with an emphasis on pharmacy operations, leadership, and the medication-use process.

Dr. Stepanovic completed his Doctor of Pharmacy at Purdue University and went on to complete a PGY1 Pharmacy Practice Residency and PGY2 Health-System Pharmacy Administration and Leadership Residency at the University of Pennsylvania. He also earned a Master of Science in Pharmaceutical Sciences with a specialization in Health-System Pharmacy Administration and Leadership from the UNC Eshelman School of Pharmacy.

Dr. Stepanovic actively collaborates with health systems, academic institutions, and professional organizations to translate evidence into practice and to develop training models that prepare the next generation of pharmacy leaders. Through his interdisciplinary background, he brings a unique perspective that bridges pharmacy practice, engineering, and leadership to advance the role of pharmacists within the evolving healthcare landscape.
